The Journeyman Tying Station

The tying station sells for about \$50. But you might like to build one for yourself just for the fun of it. I took pictures and measurements to help you out.



It has left and right side vise mounts

11 spool rods that measure about 4.75" long and less than 1/8" in diameter (0.11" or 2.9mm)

Magnetic strip to hold hooks ½" x 9"

Hand hole on each side for lifting the work bench

Two tone stains looks great.





The base 12" x 18" x .750"

You can see the shelf overhang which is 2.375" (2 1/8")



The back board measures 2 7/8" x 16 5/8"

11 spool rods are about 1.15" apart and start 3 1/8" in from the edge of the rod.



The side of the bench measures 12" x 2 7/8"

The routed hand hole start from the front 2 3/8" in and from the back 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". The wood on the top and bottom of the hand hold measures 5/8"

The vise locking hole is .350" from the top and .350" from the side. The locking screw measures 7/32".







The tool holder shelf measures 2" x 14 3/8" and all the wood used is .750 thick.

The right angle support shelf is 1.25" x 2 7/8"

The vise hole from the edges is 1.25" x .75" x 2.75"

 $20 - \frac{1}{4}$ " holes, $7 - \frac{1}{2}$ " holes

Vise hole is 3/8"



The dark wood strip in the front is 1/4" x 1/4" v 14 1/8"

The three routed hoes are 2.45" and separated by 1.15", The outer edge of the routed hole is 3.5" from shelf support. From the front edge to the middle board with the White River logo is 6 5/8"



The board with the logo measures 2 7/8" x 16 5/8". The cut out begins 1 5/8" from the edge of each side

The wood in the center to the base measures 1 ½"

The magnetic strip is ½" x 9"

OK – it is time to get started. Just think of the fun you will have building it. And I am sure that you will save money. Especially, if you have all the wood lying around. Your cost would be about \$5 but no more \$10.00. It will look different depending on the wood and stains you will use. And you built it. Good luck.
