



# Fly in my Email Dennis Stead



## R200 Fly

Jim Leckrone sent me a picture of the fly he has been tying on one of my favorite hooks, the TMC200R.

Alan Reed said that this fly was catching a lot of fish on the North Fork River and that Ty at Plateau Fly Shop showed Jim the fly. Ty said they just called it the R200 and did not know who the originator was. The name R200 was for the hook used.

A good looking fly that catches fish, lets tie it.



You will need Guinea orange and yellow feathers and SLF dubbing.



I guess one option would be to use some weight but this will be fished on a sinking line, so weight is optional.

Tie on your thread base with a little bump on the end.



Take about 5-6 barbs from each color and tie in the tail.



Tie in your hackle feather.



Use the SLF dubbing and dub in the body. I used orange, tan, and olive. Be creative and mix your own. I am sure that 5 to 6 strains of Peacock Herl would work well also.



Palmer your grizzle hackle forward, tie it down and trim off the excess



Whip finish and used a little cement.



It is fished on a sinking line and stripped. I believe this fly will catch fish in just about any tail water or river. Tie up a few dozen and try it out. Let me know where you had success with it.

- Hook: Tiemco TMC200R
- Hook Sizes: 8, 10, 12
- Thread: UTC 70 FI Fire Orange
- Tail: Guinea Barbs orange and yellow
- Hackle: Grizzly
- Body: SLF Dubbing
