## **Materials:**

Hook: TMC100 Sizes: 20, 22

Bead: Tungsten 2.0mm or 1.5mm, Black NI, or Black

**Thread: UTC 70 Rusty Brown Thread** 

**Ribbing: Small Black Wire**

Fishing instructions: Dead drift with a strike indicator, with occasional twitch, or high sticking and watch for the takes or leader action.

Put bead on hook, build a thread base.



Slide wire thru bead, tie down with few thread wraps, pull wire back, wrap to bend of hook.



Build up a tapered body. Thread about same size as bead.



Tie a half hitch. Use rotary vice to space wire.



Trap wire with thread, rotate wire until it breaks, cover wire end with thread, whip finish.





Russ uses larger hook, size 14 wide gape, shorter thinner thread body imitates smaller (size 18) midge, he feels wider gape gives better hook-ups.
