From Bob Randall: Trout Vision, continued

Trout visual perspective:

When I pick up an Adams dry fly to admire it, I see it from the side. Depending on how it was tied, I see the wings clearly. I never look at it from below like trout do.

When fished, the Adams sits in the surface film and the fish see it from below or, at best, at an angle from below. Saying that an angle is "at best" is strictly from the human perspective. For trout, the greater the angle, the less clearly they see it. They easily see the parts that are below the surface film (hackle tips which I imagine as looking like legs). Since light reflecting off of those hackle tips simply passes through water without changing medium into the eye of the trout, it should be fairly clear. They see the parts above the water through the change of medium (air to water), refraction and all. The air part of the fly may not be as clear. There is something at the boundary of the water medium and the air medium, the surface tension.

Hydrogen bonds draw molecules together and shape the surface oddly where anything touches it. It distorts the light somewhat and anything immediately on the surface is seen from below as dimples. The Adams dry fly that I admired doesn't look the same to the trout. Theirs must be an astigmatic world. Oh well, I just have to present the fly, I don't have to eat it. All you have to do is try to figure out where the fish are, then determine what they are eating and match the shape and color as well as you can to the flies in your fly box. Then you just have to get the fly to the fish, make a good presentation, set the hook, play the fish, then keep it alive until you can release it safely. Easy, right? Tight lines.

I must give credit to others as this is not my original research. I had planned another article some time back but never did much with it. When I was tasked with editing the newsletter a couple of months ago I quickly put the first article together from memory and my notes. I was unable to give proper credit.

Thanks to Larry Wegmann for sparking my original interest while he was teaching the MSU fly fishing course, as well as information, photos, and tips for the articles. Here are some links to other good resources:




