Yes, we still had to pay for the fish at \$4.75 per pound live weight. Needless to say, the fish were biting. I often hear people ask about Catch & Release at Rockbridge. Those permits are \$125 daily. Half day permits are available.

Taneycomo: USACE says the spillways for Table Rock Dam have been closed. Carolyn at River Run Outfitters reports good fishing when generation is low. "Good day nymphing all day with the big ruby and black copperhead or ruby 2 droppers."


#### **Branson Fly Fishing Expo 2019**

### Fly of the Month: Cone Bug created by Larry Olson

Materials: Daiichi 1760 2x long sz 8 hook

Sm black nickel cone head

6/0 black uni thread

.025 lead wire

Wooly bugger antron chenille sz med black w/green sparkle

Silly legs: perfectly barred pumpkin

Z - ment glue



- 1. Pinch barb and install conehead
- 2. Start lead at hook point. Make 15 wraps. Push lead inside cone and coat with z-ment.
- 3. Start thread behind lead. Wrap to bend then back over lead to hook eye, then return to bend.
- 4. Wrap strand of leg rubber around thread and tie in on top of hook to make 2 tails. 1 in long.
- 5. Strip fibers from 4 in piece of chenille and tie in at tail tie in point. wrap 3 turns then secure.
- 6. Tie in a single strand of rubber wrapped around thread, on each side to make 4 legs.
- 7. Wrap chenille forward to just short of cone and secure.
- 8. Wrap strand of rubber leg around thread and tie on top for 2 antennae.
- 9. Wrap one turn of chenille behind antenna and cone, tie off and whip finish.
- 10. Trim tails to 1in. Legs and antenna to 3/4 in.

Fishing Instructions: Fish with slow, intermittent, 3 in strips.

Larry had a lot of success with this fly in the pool just above the Bennett Spring dam.

Pic of the Month: Have you heard the rumors of a high population of cottonmouths at Crane Creek, but you've never seen one? MSU researchers were collecting cottonmouths during the latest Stream Team check at Crane Creek. Russ Doughty took this photo of one of their specimens. According to Larry Wegmann, many of the "Crane Creek cottonmouths" hide in holes in the flood plain waiting for prey to fall into the hole. This is more like copperhead behavior than cottonmouth behavior. Watch your step. Better yet, fish there in the winter. More info: Click here

#### I Wish I'd Said That

"Rivers and the inhabitants of the watery element were made for wise men to contemplate, and fools to pass by without consideration." Izaak Walton in 1653 in the *The Compleat Angler*. He was beckoning the "Brothers of the Angle".

Fishermen are called anglers because the Middle English verb for 'to fish' was angelen, and that verb came from the Old English noun for hook. The word "angle" entered the language in the Old English period as "angel" and was based on Germanic \*angg- (source also of German angel 'fishing tackle') and was used to mean "hook for fishing".
