If you can work ahead, make as many flies at home before the show. Have a bunch of cut foam and eye available.




Many of the tiers would ask the young boys and girls what their favorite colors were, and then would tie up a fly while they watched it being done.



Other boys and girls would ask if they could have a fly and pick out one of the ones already made up. Patti got patriotic.



Bill had a great idea, but was having problems with gluing the eyes on a hook. Remember, you only have to have one eye on the pin. I used epoxy and placed the eyes on the hook and eliminated the problem Bill was having. They look great and now you can tie some of you favorites.



I used 7mm doll eyes that I got at Joann's or Wal-Mart.






Remember the fly I was tying. It required a lot of work, tying the eyes on and the many steps in paint.



With an eye epoxy on the hook will greatly speed up what I was doing and it looks great.
