There was a hatch of some sort and I saw a lady catch several nice ones one a Griffins Gnat. Don't know if there were any lunkers released or not but I netted two large ones and lost two. The workers were cleaning the Rearing Ponds most of the day, during that time I cleaned out the trees of unwanted trout indicators. I used my 30 ft converted camera pole to reach the floats. So far this year I have retrieved almost 100 of all sizes. Most are reusable. All in all it was a perfect day for fishing, we won't see many more days with that kind of weather during C/R.






And he is also donating a half day guided trip for two people with the Plateau Fly Shop, a \$250 value. Prepare to bid. Bring your check books.

Fish of the Month:

Arctic Grayling
I caught my first grayling
when I was 15 years old on
vacation in Alaska. I caught
my second one last August. I
thought they only occurred in
Alaska (never mind the city of
Grayling, Michigan) until I



was encouraging an Austrian friend to fly out to an Alaskan stream where he could find them. He wasn't interested as he could catch them in Austria. Since then, I have found that the grayling is widespread throughout the Arctic and Pacific drainages in Canada, Alaska, and Siberia, as well as the upper Missouri River drainage. They occur naturally in the Arctic Ocean basin and are native to Europe, where they are widespread from the United Kingdom and France to the Ural Mountains in Russia but do not occur in the southern parts of the continent. They have been introduced in many parts of the western US as far south as Arizona. They were even introduced to Morocco in 1948, but they do not appear to have become established there. I have heard that it is a "key subsistence species" for the Iñupiat people of the Alaska North Slope. In the British magazine "Trout and Salmon", one fishing specialist commented that "it's many years since I ate grayling ... an earthy taste -certainly never to be repeated. Yet I know some anglers who prefer them to trout."

Fly of the Month: Zonker

The first time I ever saw a Zonker fly was when I pulled one out of a tree at Crane Creek. I didn't know what it was and had to ask an expert (Ralph Eichholz). I used it several times with success and it was soon my favorite fly. I tried to find it but couldn't. I wonder what happened to it. I'll bet it's in another tree somewhere. I've tied a few using different patterns but I think the zonker fly tied by Jeremy Hunt, owner of FlysandGuides in Branson, MO, has a good look to it. Printed with permission from FlysandGuides.

Flexi Cord Zonker http://www.flysandguides.com/how-to-tie-flexi-cord-zonker

Recipe:

Hook: TMC 5262 size 2-6 (or any streamer hook will work)

Thread: UTC 140 (white) or color to match the body

Body: Flexi-cord (silver) these come in several sizes, match

the right size to the hook size Wing: Rabbit strips (white)

Collar: Rabbit

Eyes: Prisma stick-ons (black) or whatever color you like.
