Hunt & Fish Outdoor Show: Last year we went to the Arc of the Ozarks outdoor show. It was a great success. This year we want to go back again. John Bush has been our fishing trip coordinator for a few years now. He has stepped down from that position recently. Since John actually has a job unlike most of us, his planned trips were almost always on a Saturday. He believes that weekday trips may attract better attendance. Fishing Reports:

-December 2, Bennett Spring, Larry Olson and Bob Randall arrived at BSSP and absolutely no one was there. We checked the calendar to make sure it was Monday and not Tuesday. Fish were hitting very lightly. We used a number of flies with some success on each. There was activity on or just below the surface. Bob took a few fish on dry flies but the size and color of the fly was wrong. Larry was doing well with a silver/gray scud just below the Gut Hole. Bob switched to a similar fly and did well with it along the outflow stream. Toward the end of the day, another angler was very successful on a size 16 dark brown hare's ear nymph.

-December 6, Mike Kidd, Ron Ward, and Dick Solomon caught over 330 trout at Bennett Spring today primarily stripping dark colored streamers.

-December 7, Harry Morgan and Bob Randall at BSSP each caught around 50 trout. Keith Coffey was also there. Early in the day, Keith and Harry were slaying them just below the Gut Hole on olive or brown streamers. Keith caught one that he estimated at 5 pounds and a couple more at about 2 pounds. Harry and Bob both caught some good fish. They must have released some of the brood stock. A lot of them had hook jaws.

-December 9, Harry Morgan, Larry Olson, and Bob Randall at Bennett Spring near the Gut Hole did well. Bob caught somewhere near 80 fish, Harry caught more, and Larry less. Bob used a small wingless dry fly and did very well on the surface. Later he used a dark grey sowbug and did well in the outflow stream. Harry used an orange worm with weighted head and later a yellow and black jig with great success. Larry moved to the pool above the dam and using streamers caught some very nice fish, the largest of which was about 20 inches.

-December 13, Friday the 13th was pretty good for MTFA members at Bennett Spring. Without much coordination at least 7 of us showed up. Fishing was Mike Kidd, Ron Ward, Harry Morgan, Keith Coffey, John Dozier, Larry Olson, and Bob Randall. There was only moderate success stripping streamers below the Gut Hole with Ron using this method best. More successful were thin mints (similar to a wooly bugger) at the top of the Gut Hole and grey scuds. Mike and Harry caught over 100 fish, Ron caught 54, Bob caught 52. Most of this activity was near the Gut Hole both below it and in the outflow stream above it. Larry's preferred fishing method is stripping streamers and/or swinging nymphs which he deployed in the pool just above the concrete dam. He had moderate success there but observed that fishermen fishing deep against the dam landed many fish. They must have been holding right at depth at that location.

-December 23, Larry Olson caught more than 30 trout at BSSP stripping and swinging between the Gut Hole and the Whistle Bridge. Nymphs, streamers, and tigertails.

-December 27, Larry Olson, Dick Solomon, Keith Coffey, Bob Randall at BSSP, lots of people, especially kids. School's out. Go figure. Fishing somewhat slow. They would hit on a fly for a while and stop. Change flies, bite would be good, then stop. The most caught by any of us was 36 fish, some much less.

Midafternoon, searching for a place to get away from the crowd, I found solitude on the main stream 75 yards or so up from the Gut Hole. I noticed a few flying midges and a minor amount of fish feeding activity near and on the water surface. The smallest dry fly I had was a size 20. I had some strikes, then a hookup. That's my idea of fishing. Bob Randall

A few times, the action I experienced was using the tiniest dry fly I could tie onto my finest tippet. I also caught a few using the zebra midge, Dorsey's top secret midge, the harvester midge, and Dave Tucker's gilled midge. Bob Randall



"Midges will be the bread and butter of the winter fly fishing, and make up the majority of a trout's diet. Midges will hatch during the warmest parts of the day often from 10 am – 3 pm and can bring nearly every fish in the river to the surface. •Wings: Kreinik Metallic Pearl very fine #4 - No. 032 11M or fine #8 - No. 032 10M
