June Speaker - Taressa Wise MDC (Greene County Conservation Agent)

NEWS THAT AFFECTS FISH AND FISHING:

The Clean Water Act: The U.S. Supreme Court redefined the word "adjacent" by removing the concept of "a significant nexus" and inserting the requirement of "continuous surface connection". The specific case which led to the opinion resulted in a unanimous agreement that the application of the CWA was incorrect. However, the definition which affects the overall value of the law was hotly contested within the court. River Run Outfitters reports good fishing at Taneycomo. From Carolyn Parker at River Run Outfitters in Branson: 5/24 "Seeing no generation during the morning hours, then two, three or four units on for a while in the late morning or early afternoon for five to six hours. Fishing has been great. Successful flies have been the copper dun midge, rainbow and micro scuds, the ruby 2 midge, the JQ streamer, the rusty midge and the 56er. Just have to comment on the great quality of the fish we are catching. They are all healthy, and FAT! And, we are catching more fish on a regular basis above 17 inches!"

Tim's Fly Shop at Roaring River: Water is low and clear, 39 CFS, perfect for dry flies and sight fishing with marabou jigs and worms, really good quality water right now. Beetles, ants, small hoppers, caddis, blue wing olives, griffiths gnats, and It. cahills are all catching trout right now. 9' 7X leaders will really be your best bet with the small dries.

I'm still getting by with 9' 6X leaders when using nymphs, buggers, egg patterns and crackle backs. sow bugs, scuds, pheasant tails and hares ears all worked pretty good this past week. Pink san juan worms were good to this past week.

Marabou jigs are really working good, olive, black/yellow, white, and the tan have all been productive lately. 4lb line, 2lb line is recommended right now, camo line is horrible in this water, stick with moss green lines and lines that are clear, blue, yellow, white, and braid does not work well when the water is this clear. Good luck on the river this week. From Tim Homesely

Larry's Sporting Goods Bennett Spring Tip of the Week: The water at Bennett has been high most of the month of April an early May. Currently up about 10 inches over normal for this time of year. I hope to see the water back down and in better shape by the weekend. You will want to avoid the faster current and fish the seams where the fast and slow water meet. You can also have success fishing on the downstream side of any structure. From Logan Miller, New Owner of Larry's Fly Shop.

Editor's note: According to the USGS water report, the water level at Bennett Spring is coming down.

Fishing Reports:

Chris Diggins: Emily and I fished the Green River, below the Flaming Gorge dam in UT. We floated the river for four days with two exceptional guides from Old Moe's Guide Services out of Dutch John, UT. We caught rainbow and browns with Emily netting a 21 1/4 brown, and a 22 1/2 inch rainbow. We used midges in the morning and BWO's in the afternoon. When fishing slowed mid day, we used San Juan worms on the



upper fly and pheasant tails on the bottom which perked things up a bit.

The water was fairly low for this time of the year due to work at the dam, with water flowing about 800. We fished the A section which is a seven mile stretch from the base of dam to "Little Hole" where we exited the river. The water was a bit dirty in section B due to the runoff of melting snow.

Kim Schultz: May 23, 2023 (Tuesday): Rod and my last trip fish was April 25 fishing James River. Since then, we several significant rainfalls elevated the rivers to near flooding conditions. We decided to hold off going back to James River and check out Little Sac River. Stockton Lake has come up 18" since our last trip, with the Little Sac about normal flow and gage height for this time of the year. We did not find catching to be easy, we did release nine white bass, two carp, a shad and a 36" gar pike. The pike has a foul hooked and it broke the line on the shore as I was about to get a photo. The eagle was perched up stream from me. The lake is now backed up the second power line and that is where I caught most of the white bass. The gar pike are moving up with many in the S curve. Rod and I hope to get back to James River in the next week. 2.41 ft 130cfs 869.8 ft



Bob Randall: White River, Cotter, AR, Larry Olson and I booked a trip 17 months ago for the first of May. Who knew the wind would be howling at 40 mph? It was tough casting and the guide worked his hbrc off trying to keep the boat positioned properly. We each caught 4 brownies on nymphs. Larry also caught a nice bow. Tried to fish dries but the wind was just too much.
