

## Fly fishing for beginners: Two-part program -Bob Randall



No officers, no club rules, no cost to come and join.



Fishing Report from Kim Schultz:

Bennett Spring State Park late summer fishing report 20251025 by Kim Schultz

Rod and I have been to Bennett Spring numerous times the last two months. The fishing has been good with morning fishing stripping a streamer of wooly bugger through the water column. The afternoon, the trout begin to hit emergers (midges or anything else wiggling under the surface). I have found the crackle back in a variety of colors works very good as a dry fly. It does not need to be small fly, a #14 is very effective. Here is my reports for August and September:

#### AUG 8, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

Rod made the call for a club outing at BS. Rod, Bob Andy, Linda and I fished in zone 2. Rod and I started at the Bluff hole and caught a few trout. Linda came in later and fished with us. After a few hours moved upstream to the corner where Bob and Andy were fishing. Bob reported they the fishing was good. Everyone except for me stopped for lunch. I stayed until late afternoon fishing the corner hike with many fish in the stream.

#### AUG 15, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

I fished BS today and in the water by 8 AM. I stopped at 3:30 PM and kept three trout and caught twenty-six. I saw a water snake that swam towards a fisherwoman, she did get an immediate fright but stood her ground. I saw it swimming towards her and gave a heads up. She kept cool about it. I did not see many trout on top water; a #10 Pistol Pete was the best lure fishing the afternoon.

#### AUG 19, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

Rod called me the night before letting me know he and his brother-in-law Terry would be fishing Bennett Spring. I was slow leaving Springfield and it was after 8 AM until I made it into the park. Rod and Terry were fishing above the Whistle Bridge. I drove from the spring to the Niangua River taking a few photos of the spring since the was a fog on the water and there was one scenic view after another. My last trip I tied up a few Pistol Pete flies, and the trout were for several periods of time throughout the day giving chase, so I tied a few more for this trip. However, they were not as effective this day. I did fish many streams of assorted sizes and description. My best rapid catching was wading upstream from the corner and taking trout on dry flies along the high banks fishing river right. I fished later, calling it a day after six PM with nineteen trout caught and released.

#### Kim Schultz fishing report continued:

#### AUG 26, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

I fished BS today with Bob Randall and Andy Andrews already in the water when I first entered the water at 7:30 AM. I caught thirty-five trout and one green sunfish with five trout near sixteen inches. It was a good day. Glad to see and Andy and Bob on the water.

#### AUG 29, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

I fished the corner and finished at 2PM, still not many people. I finished with thirty-three trout and one green sunfish. The upstream water from the corner still good for dry flies.

#### Sept 2, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

I fished Bennett Spring today. I was there before sunrise and started with the morning horn (7:30AM). It was a pleasant day with occasional cloud cover. Bob and Andy met me at the MTFA Memorial. It was a light crowd and a slow beginning with only a few trout caught. Andy and I fished the corner with Bob fishing the opposite bank. After an hour, I moved up stream and put on a crackle back fishing it dry. I called it quits at 4:30PM and released forty trout, one was at least three pounds, and several more near fifteen inches. It was a good day of fishing and a good day to be in the water.

Sept 3 – Sept 10, 2025: I went to Michigan for a funeral. I did spend some time at the lake casting out to blue-gill and bass. My brother and I did get to fish early one morning for a mess of blue gill.

#### Sept 15, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park (BS)

My daughter can fish occasionally on Monday. I told Jenn about some success at BS. We left Springfield after 10AM, a late start. So, we started to fish a little after 11. We fished the shallow water below the Arch bridge. We did find a few trout ready to take dry flies and #14 crackle back seems to be a good fly to use on recent trips. We caught a shower at 2:30PM and called it quits, we caught 25 trout for 3.5 hours of fishing.

#### Sept 19, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park

I return to Bennett Spring; the MDC announced a halt of work on the Hatchery. One must wonder what is next. The area is a mess with exposed rebar, incomplete work on the raceways, and exposed dirt. I hope they can come up with a plan and find a contractor to finish the job. I fished the corner sticking with the crackle back dry flies with success. I finished the day with thirty trout.

Kim Schultz fishing report continued:


Sept 24, 2025: Bennett Spring State Park.

I left Springfield 6:30 AM with rain on the windshield. The rain let up on the drive. I did see an eagle a few miles out of the park and a small deer feeding along the roadside. The day was overcast with a few sprinkles throughout the day. Rod and his brother-in-law Terry were already in the water fishing the whistle bridge. I started the day above the outlet in zone 2 and fished my way upstream. I managed ten trout by noon, Rod and Terry were picking up fish, catching them on a slow retrieve. They left at noon. I move up from the corner to test the crackle backs again. The catching was steady with more people moving in mid-afternoon. The day was overcast with occasional sprinkles but not enough to wear a raincoat. It was 4:30PM, a clap the thunder was heard, I was able to finish fishing at the corner, slow pull a crackle back through the water column to pick up a few more trout, did catch one nearly eighteen inches. I finished the day with forty-one trout. When I returned to the truck and pulling off mu waders the rain returned with a drenching rain.

Overall, the fishing at Bennett Spring has been good. I would recommend using different methods of fishing from stripping a fly, to fishing upstream throwing a dry. I figure a few more trips to Bennett Spring before heading to the lakes to find white bass off the points.
